

Stephen E. Fienberg is Maurice Falk University Professor of Statistics and Social Science at Carnegie Mellon University, with appointments in the Department of Statistics, the Machine Learning Department, and CyLab. He has served as Dean of the College of Humanities and Social Sciences at Carnegie Mellon and as Vice President for Academic Affairs at York University, in Toronto, Canada, as well as on the faculties of the University of Chicago and the University of Minnesota. He co-founded *Chance* magazine, served as the Coordinating and Applications Editor of the *Journal of the American Statistical Association*, and is currently an Editor of the *Annals of Applied Statistics*. His work on confidentiality and disclosure limitation addresses issues related to respondent privacy in both surveys and censuses as well as in various other public and private databases. He served as a member of the NRC Committee on Technical and Privacy Dimensions of Information for Terrorism Prevention and Other National Goals whose report is forthcoming. Fienberg is a member of the National Academy of Sciences, a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and the Royal Society of Canada, and Thorsten Sellin Fellow of the American Academy of Political and Social Science.
