



HOW TO CHANGE EVERYTHING: A Conversation with Naomi Klein on Her New YA Book

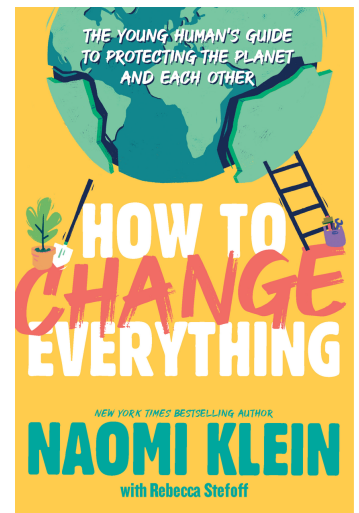
