The Department of Communication seeks assistant, associate, full, or distinguished professors who have the following foci to join the department in Fall 2019:

Health Communication and Community Engagement: We welcome applications from scholars conducting theory-driven, applied research that addresses real-world problems and challenges faced by communities. We are particularly interested in scholars with an active research program that is focused on addressing health disparities and social determinants of health.

Interpersonal Relationships and Health: We seek candidates whose scholarship focuses on the ways in which communication in interpersonal relationships is involved in the management and maintenance of health and wellness. We invite applications from scholars studying communication in various types of relationships, including family, romantic, friendship, professional, and/or patient-provider relationships, and the ways in which communication in such relationships relates to a wide range of health and wellness issues.

We welcome applications from scholars who use quantitative, qualitative, and mixed methods (including social network approaches). We seek candidates whose scholarship about health communication intersects with, and extends, one or more of the department's other research foci: organizational communication, communication and technology, interpersonal communication, and language and social interaction. Proven ability (or promise with respect to) securing external research funding is a strength. We look forward to welcoming colleagues who will contribute to our thriving undergraduate and masters programs and our highly-regarded interdisciplinary school-wide Ph.D. program.

Rutgers University's School of Communication and Information houses a dynamic and engaged community of scholars whose fields of communication, information science, library studies, journalism, and media studies intersect to address contemporary challenges. Qualifications

A Ph.D. or equivalent degree in a relevant field is expected as of August 2019. Applicants should have a demonstrated record or strong likelihood of top-tier peer-reviewed publication and evidence of or preparation for effective teaching. Senior-level applicants should provide evidence of leadership in research, instruction, and service. A record of external funding is a plus.

Requirements

Responsibilities of tenure-track/tenured faculty members include undergraduate and graduate teaching assignments in communication, an active program of research in the candidate's area of scholarly expertise, and service contributions in accordance with the university policy for tenure-track and tenured appointments.
